#### **Chuck Lawson**

- The Grad celebration and Virtual Awards ceremony took place in the last week and went very well. The grads had videos over 3 nights, got a sign for their lawn, a T-shirt, cookies and other goodies.
- Planning for regular return in September. Timetable semester 4 courses per semester. Tues and Thurs will be double block days which is something new added after feedback from this past year.
- Career Education will look different there will be one teacher moving with all the way grades 9-12 with the kids to establish a relationship and help guide them
- Flex will be different next year partnering with myFlex app where students can own their learning times
- The expansion is really moving along well now. There is a link on the GW website to the capital projects.
- Link Crew is senior students mentoring grade 9's invite coming and event before September start.

## Natasha asked two questions:

- 1) Parking along Thomas Rd right along the road with the bus loop. Why is there a large stretch in the middle of "no parking"? What purpose does it serve? Mr. Lawson responded that City has not informed him as why.
- 2) Seating/benches out front noticed there doesn't seem to be much for benches or seating out front of school. Mr. Lawson responded that it is being discussed as the expansion happens but there may be concerns about homeless using the benches after hours, so safety is a consideration.
